Product to be used:

NUFARM FLOWABLE SIMAZINE LIQUID HERBICIDE
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 500 g/L simazine as the only active constituent,

NUFARM SIMAZINE 900 DF HERBICIDE
PLUS OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 900 g/kg simazine as the only active constituent.

Directions for Use:

Almonds (<i>Prunus amygdalus</i>)	Broadleaf weeds and grasses	<u>500 g/L products</u> 1.7 – 3.5 L/ha
		<u>900 g/kg products</u> 0.8 – 1.6 kg/ha

Critical Use Comments:

Use only if trees are at least 3 years old. Apply to bare moist soil immediately after cultivation and before weeds emerge.

Withholding Period:

Not required when used as directed.

Jurisdiction:

ACT, NSW, QLD, TAS, NT, WA only.

Additional Conditions:

This Permit provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.
